## *Success – Thanks to Many*

A major organization goal will soon be accomplished, thanks to the assistance of many.

The new pumps will soon be installed into our golf course irrigation system. The concrete pad has been installed, and electric power will be made available in a few weeks to make the new pumps operational.

The same volunteer construction crew that installed the walking bridge to the new number ten green will construct a new pump house for the system.

This important task will be completed with contributed funds thus not requiring the borrowing of large sums of money, paying the debt serve, raising fees or annual dues.

When completed, we will specifically acknowledge all who have assisted with a permanent plaque placed in the lodge.

In summary, 66 have completed their pledges, four have made partial payments and eight have assured us that they will soon honor their pledges. Approximately five volunteers will build the new pump house, Bob Davis assured the availability of power, and Frank Watkins and his crew will oversee the project. Approximately ninety different people made this important event possible. Both golfers and non golfers and the general community will be well served for years to come because of this great accomplishment.

- Applicants must be citizens of the United States on the date their applications are signed; permanent legal resident status does not qualify.
- Male and female students compete separately.

Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need.

All scholarships are in the form of certificates of award conditional upon the full-time enrollment of the winner in an accredited U.S. college or university.

Applications must advance through local, district and state competitions to reach national judging. The Chicago office of the Elks National Foundation will notify the 500 national finalists by email by February 28, 2011. To be eligible for an award, national finalists will be required to submit a secondary application online. The national finalists will also be required to mail their Student Aid Report to the ENF. These applications are due March 25, 2011.

The Chicago office of the Elks National Foundation will announce the 500 national winners, and notify them in writing, by April 15, 2011. (Many local Lodges, districts and state Elks associations award their own scholarships through this program. These scholarships are not to be confused with the 500 Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Scholarships.)

Ranging from \$1,000 per year to \$15,000 per year, Most Valuable Student scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), in a U.S. college or university.
